a)Hinanaling Pagbangon

A program to ensure that individuals and families are protected against the impact of natural calamities and human-induced hazards



[A] Hinanaling Pagbangon

1. Prepare communities against environmental risk by conducting hazard mapping, vulnerability and risk assessment for effective mitigation

2. LDRRMO must prepare for upcoming disaster

3. Coordinate with DSWD for relief goods

4. Build conducive but temporary evacuation centers

5. Avail of People Survival Fund to provide technical and financial assistance for LGU to implement adaptation measures

6. Identify safe areas for the construction of transition houses prior to relocation of victims permanent resettlement areas

7. Improve timely delivery of response recovery and rehabilitation efforts

Strategies for Environmental Sector

b) Pag-atiman sa Kinaiyahan

A program to improve environmental quality by rehabilitating and restoring degraded natural resources thru the implementation of Forest Land Use Plan (FLUP) Ecological Solid Waste Management Program (ESWMP) and Local Climate Change Action Plan (LCCAP)

1. Implement reforestation activities to restore ecosystem by implementing five (5) hectare per barangay tree growing program and Ilog-Saug Rivers Reforestation Program

2. Enhance green spaces in urban area

3. Enforce ecological solid waste management program

- State of the Art Sanitary Landfill that will cater the solid waste of the Municipality as well as neighboring Town/City in a mutual understanding on payment for revenue generations. There is always money in the garbage it is just a matter of prioritizing plans and programs. Landfill entails cost to the Municipality but we could venture into a Public-Private Joint venture Scheme
- Tree Nursery Establishment with enough supply of seedlings for the Greening program of the Municipality especially in the upland areas, logged-over areas in coordination with the Barangay Officials. Flooding in the lower areas of Asuncion was due to depleted forest resources, we may not have a hand on water source of the Libuganon river portion but we have in our site the areas influenced by Saug River, and that is our initial areas for program development.

- MENRO Office with complete data bank where any sources of information with regards to MENRO Operations will be provided transparently. It is a dream to have an office that is digital in operations likewise be an ISO accredited.
- Vermicomposting of biodegradable wastes at Asuncion Materials Recovery center (AMRC)
- Procurement of Additional Brand New Garbage Collection Vehicle that would address the collection concerns
- Establishment/Re-establishment of Barangay based MRF and provide policies/ordinances that will mandate household to cooperate in the MRF system
- Designate and establish Municipal Environment Critical Area and provide support for its maintenance, development, and implement ordinances too avoid risk of life and property
- Develop, maintain, and protect Municipal Forest Reserve and Municipal Watershed Area

- Close monitoring of the Sand and Gravel mining operations within the political jurisdiction of Asuncion
- Create a pool of well verse trainers that provide education to the community on the value of better and sustained environment
- Provide support to the Executive implementers by proposing environmental researched-based ordinances in accordance with the vision of the Mayor
- Creation of Buffer zone/shoreland in the forest reserves and along the rivers of Asuncion
- Clean-up/Rehabilitation, and preservation of all the rivers in Asuncion particularly the Saug River
- Creation and mobilization of inspection and inventory teams too survey septic tanks of private homes and along river banks
- Development of environment code of Asuncion

- Constant Monitoring of the Environmental Impact Assessment of all the project and establishments in the Municipality of Asuncion
- Others as lawfully ordered by the Municipal Mayor

A program to make local government trustworthy of people's trust, deliver public goods and service in a timely manner, provide immediate relief from the grind of daily living of constituents, responsive to the needs of the people, and enforce regulation which is fair, necessary and not too burdensome
